Physical injury and anxiety	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The event is planned and supervised by GAP staff Make participants aware of potential hazards through introduction and demonstrations before any activity takes place. Adequate warm up time given. School staff are responsible for first aid for and on their participants. Schools are advised of this responsibility prior to GAP staff attending. Staff are first aid trained An appropriately stocked first aid kit is present at each event. Staff aware of where additional first aid can be found at the school reception Injured participants/School Staff/ GAP Staff not moved until inspected by school staff/emergency services as necessary. Pre-existing medical conditions must be notified by school staff to GAP staff. Any medication required is with the person who requires it, e.g. asthma inhaler. Mobile phone to be available to summon prompt medical assistance without leaving the casualty. No chewing gum permitted during the event. Equipment is checked. Only appropriate equipment to be used. Equipment is only used in way it was intended. Know the full site address for the location of the session. Accurate instruction and site access is required for the emergency services. Correct footwear is specified to participants prior to the session. School staff will be required to provide assistance to help flush out eye irritation with water. School to be made aware that participants/staff may wear sunglasses to avoid contact with eyes and long sleeve tops to avoid powder on arms. Full Instructions issued at start to volunteers/school staff. 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Physical injury and anxiety (contd)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff will disallow participation if the footwear is inappropriate. All footwear laces must be tied. If a participant's footwear is unsuitable or unsafe, the participant will not be allowed to carry on competing / taking part until their footwear is made safe or more suitable footwear is worn. No jewellery including watches / smart watches allowed to be worn by participants. Sports clothing to be worn by participants. Long hair of staff and participants is always tied back. Staff supervise the session activities and ensure physical or violent conduct is not permitted. No deliberate intent to harm will be tolerated. Participants are informed of disciplinary guidance and removal from the event can be actioned. Participants to be supervised at all times. Participants not to go outside of the session areas. All activities are within an identified area which is communicated to staff and participants. Schools should notify GAP Staff if a participant is discovered to be lost. School and GAP staff ensure a thorough search is conducted of the session site. Activities are appropriately spaced to reduce risks of collision. Improvised equipment is not used if it compromises safe practice. Replacement and repair of equipment is acted upon promptly when reported. Participants are made aware of hazards and possible risks.
