

Round 5 - Football


How many children can complete the cone pass relay?

Equipment needed: Two cones per team and one ball. However you may want multiple teams.

Rules

- [Watch this video first](#)....it is the North Macedonia Football Team doing a warm up
- Split your class/bubble into an even number of teams. The children should line up one behind the other.
- The first 2 children in the line should have a cone each, These can be small marker cones.
- The first child should have a football. They will run out approx 10 metres, balancing the ball in their cone and throw and catch their ball (in a cone) to the player in the team next to them. They will then run back to their team and throw to the next player, who should catch in their cone.
- They should then pass the cone to the next person in the queue and join the back of the line.
- There is no need to head the ball like the North Macedonia players.
- The game should restart when a ball touches the ground.
- How many children can complete the relay before the ball touches the floor?
- More lines will mean more points, but also more risk of dropping! Your team can decide how they would like to play.

How can we earn points for our school?

A school will be allocated the points in the league table each week. If a school wins the fixture they will be allocated 10 points; lose the fixture 2 points; draw the fixture 5 points.

An additional 10 bonus points are available to all schools each week by completing tasks and challenges. These could prove crucial in final league standings as the weeks progress.

When will the fixtures and competitions be announced?

Your school fixture will be announced when your school receives details of the next competition

What happens if we win the league?

A Trophy and a whole school event of your choice, will be awarded to the school who finishes at the Top of the League.
